- Following the second response, there will be a period during which the debaters will respond to questions and comments from the audience.
- Following the audience comments, the audience will be polled again and a new vote taken in response to the proposition.
- The winner of the debate is the one who moves the largest number of votes over to his or her side.



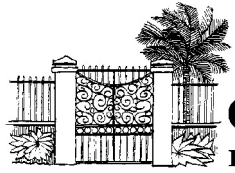

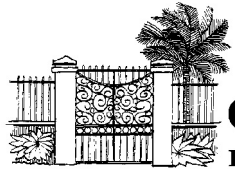

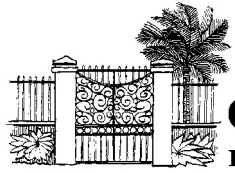

3 Minute Response



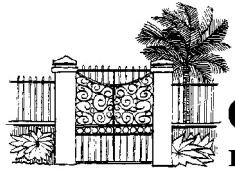
